

Discharge of infant to postnatal ward

Purpose

All infants who are discharged from the NNU, with all ongoing care being handed over to parents and midwifery team on the postnatal ward.

Principles of care

Safety of infant

Effective communication

Equipment

Cot, Documentation, Discharge checklist

Procedure

- Infant identified as being appropriate for discharge back to postnatal ward by both nursing and medical staff.
- Ensure baby check has been completed and documented on infant's TRAK.
- Decision to discharge discussed with Mother's named midwife, to ensure discharge back to ward safe and appropriate.
- Inform parents of decision to discharge back to the ward.
- Staff member caring for infant must ensure discharge checklist is complete and discharge letter is ready. (see pic 1) If infant falls under criteria led discharge, nurse must ensure that criteria led discharge form is completed and signed by either a middle grader, team leader or special care coordinator. (see pic 2)
- Infant can then be taken back to postnatal ward by staff member caring for infant. All personal belongings and required paperwork must be with infant on discharge.
- On the postnatal ward, the infant must be handed over to the receiving midwife. X2 name bands must be present on infant and checked with midwife. Name band must include infants name, date of birth, hospital number and gender.
- It is important to highlight to midwife if any further antibiotics will be required following discharge from NNU.
- Infant must be transferred into postnatal ward cot. NNU cot must be returned to dirty utility room for cleaning.
- Ensure all discharge documentation complete on badger and infant is removed from bed space.
