PRIOR TO THIS VISIT PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RECOMMENDATIONS:
Oral feeds can be introduced as set out below.
Breast feeding/EBM
Put to breast and encourage skin to skin contact.
Babies with cleft lip (with or without gum involvement) should be positioned with the breast filling the gap, for example cleft side down, to assist a lip seal.
If palate involvement please assist mother in hand expressing and offer colostrum via cup Babies born with cleft palate are unable to create sufficient intra oral pressure required to successfully feed at breast. Baby can still be breast milk fed, Cleft CNS can provide loan of dual electric breast pump for up to 1 year.
If concerned about volumes please top up via cup.
Bottle feeding
Offer feeds from standard bottle and orthodontic teat.
Babies born with cleft palate are unable to create sufficient intra oral pressure, baby may take only small volume from standard bottle.
If concerned about volumes please top up via cup.
Cleft CNS will visit to assess baby and feeding, commencing assisted feeding when appropriate.
