Clinical Guidelines Summary

Referrals to ENT for tonsillectomy for paediatric and adult patients should fulfil all these criteria:

- Sore throats are due to acute tonsillitis
- The episodes of sore throat are disabling and prevent normal functioning
- Frequency:
 - 7 episodes of tonsillitis in 1 year
 - 5 episodes of tonsillitis every year for 2 preceding years
 - 3 episodes of tonsillitis every year for 3 preceding years

If patients do not fulfil this criteria, primary care clinician should advise a six-month period of watchful waiting, keeping a diary of symptoms and reviewing patients after this period of observation.

Note:

For paediatric referrals who do not meet the above criteria, earlier referral can be considered in these clinical situations:

- Multiple antibiotic allergies/intolerances
- PFAPA (periodic fever, apthous stomatitis, pharyngitis and adenitis)
- History of >1 peritonsillar abscess



Guideline Body
