


Background & Context

- Date of admission
 - Date of death, ITU admission or other significant event
 - Patient admitted from (home, care home, transferring hospital, other)
 - Referral diagnosis
 - Post take ward round diagnosis if applicable
 - Cause of death
- 

Mortality review findings

1. Was there an intervention(s) which could have been made anytime prior to the patient's death that potentially could have impacted on the patient's outcome?
2. What do the findings tell us about our systems?

Highlight any issues with:

- Diagnostics
- Treatment
- Communication
- Recognise or rescue
- Scope of care
- Other (patient fall in hospital, hospital acquired pressure sore, hospital acquired infection, hospital acquired DVT, readmission within 30 days)
- Were there concerns about the pre hospital care? (including primary care, ambulance, emergency department)

Summary

Which statement best describes the management of this case?

- There were no areas of concern
- There were areas of concerns but they made no difference to the actual outcome
- There were areas of concerns which may have contributed to the actual outcome
- There were areas of concerns which caused the outcome which would otherwise not have been expected to occur.

Discussion
